### 3 Toccare [Lingua guida].

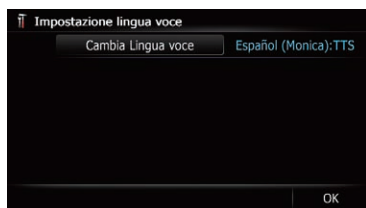


Viene visualizzata la schermata "Selezione lingua voce".

Dopo un breve intervallo, il caricamento viene completato e viene visualizzata di nuovo la schermata "Impostazioni locali".

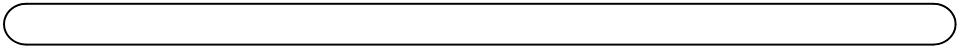
### 7 Toccare [OK] sulla schermata "Impostazioni locali".

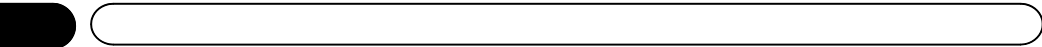
Viene visualizzato un messaggio che chiede di confermare il riavvio del sistema di navigazione.

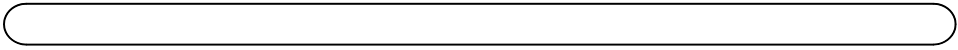
### 8 Toccare [OK].
